

## **2014-2015 CMAC Sports Team Highlights**

- Shroder won the Cincinnati Metro Athletic Conference football league championship with a 5-0 league record, finishing the season 9-1 overall. The Jags qualified for the State Playoffs in Division II. Anthony Brown was voted CMAC Offensive Player of the Year and Gerald Warmack was recognized as CMAC Coach of the Year.
- Hughes won the CMAC Volleyball championship with a league record of 10-0 and 12-6 overall. Tiona Lattimore from Hughes was voted CMAC Player of the Year and Rochelle Adams from Woodward was recognized as CMAC Coach of the Year.
- Aiken won the CMAC Boys Varsity Basketball title with an 8-2 Conference record and 14-7 overall. Carlik Jones was voted CMAC Player of the Year and Leon Ellison, Jr. the CMAC Boys Coach of the Year.
- Hughes H.S. won the CMAC Girls Varsity Basketball Championship with a conference record of 10-0 and 16-7 overall. Lea Coulter was voted CMAC Player of the Year and Anita Burke from Hughes was recognized as CMAC Girls Coach of the Year.
