

## **2015-2016 CMAC Sports Team Highlights**

- Taft won the American Division of the Southwest Ohio Public League with a 6-0 league record, finishing the season 7-2 overall, The Senators qualified for the State Playoffs in Division IV. Nykwuan Presswood was voted American Division Offensive Player of the Year and Greg Conwell from Taft was recognized as American Division Coach of the Year.
- Will Coker from Woodward was voted Southwest Ohio Public League National Division Offensive Player of the Year and Isaiah Lyles from Aiken was recognized as National Division Defensive Player of the Year.
- Hughes won the CMAC Volleyball championship with a league record of 10-0 and 16-4 overall. Tiona Lattimore from Hughes was voted CMAC Player of the Year and Nathan Lane from Hughes was recognized as CMAC Coach of the Year.
- Aiken won the CMAC Boys Varsity Basketball title with a 10-0 Conference record and 18-3 overall. Carlik Jones was voted CMAC Player of the Year and Leon Ellison, Jr. the CMAC Boys Coach of the Year. The Falcons won the Division II Regional Championship which earned Aiken its first ever trip to the State Division II Final Four.
- Hughes won the CMAC Girls Varsity Basketball Championship with a conference record of 10-0 and 14-7 overall Lea Coulter was voted CMAC Player of the Year and Anita Burke from Hughes was recognized as CMAC Girls Coach of the Year.
- Aiken defeated Taft 43-38 to win the Boys Junior High CMAC City Championship and the Dater Montessori Junior High Girls defeated Shroder 24-20 to win the Girls Championship. Taft defeated Western Hills 36-28 to win the Boys Freshman Basketball Tournament.
